For Immediate Release – September 25, 2017

The three girls have been located and are safe.

On Monday, September 25, 2017, the Oneida County Sheriff's Office received a call from Matthew Zimmermann of 5700 Rolling Woods Drive in Lake Tomahawk reporting that his daughters ran away during the night. They left a letter stating that the three were ready to live in the wilderness.

The girls information is the following: Jessa M. Zimmermann, age 14, and Mallory J. Zimmermann, age 14 and Jasmine E. Zimmermann, age 12. (see attached photos)

Oneida County Sheriff's Deputies are searching the area with the assistance of Newbold Fire Department, Lake Tomahawk Fire Department, Minocqua Fire Department and Little Rice Canteen. This investigation is ongoing. Any questions should be directed to Chief Deputy Daniel Hess.
