The Oneida County Sheriff's Office is sponsoring a Wisconsin DNR certified snowmobile safety course. The date, times and location for the course are as follows:

In conjunction with the New-Tom Sno Fleas Snowmobile Club, Saturday December 14th and Sunday December 15th 2019. Course times are from 9:00 AM to 1:30 PM on Saturday December 14th and 9:00 AM to 1:30 PM on Sunday December 15th. The course will be held at the New Tom Sno Fleas groomer barn located at 6777 Badger RD, Lake Tomahawk, WI.

Age Requirement. Anyone born on or after January 1, 1985 and at least 12 years old must have snowmobile safety certification to operate on public areas.

Students are now required to obtain a DNR customer ID number for any recreational safety class they attend. Please contact the DNR at 1-888-936-7463 to obtain this number before the course begins.

Students must be 12 years old to enroll. There is no maximum age, and parents and adults are encouraged to enroll and participate in this course. Cost for each course is \$10 per person.
