### NEWS RELEASE

For Immediate Release – April 21, 2026

On Tuesday, April 21, 2026 at approximately 7:43 am, Oneida County Sheriff's Office received a call from a 59-year old female, Susan M. Titus of Little Rice who stated she had been struck by a vehicle and sustained injuries at the intersection of Kelly Fire Lane and Rozell Road in the town of Little Rice. Oneida County Sheriff's Deputies responded to the scene. Initial investigation showed that a 1994 White GMC, operated by a 59-year old male, Robert R. Cookson of Little Rice, struck Titus and fled the scene at a high rate of speed. Oneida County Sheriff's Deputies located Cookson's vehicle and conducted a traffic stop a short time later. Titus was transported by Oneida County ambulance to Tomahawk Aspirus Hospital for her injuries. Injuries for Titus is unknown at this time.

The investigation is ongoing and being conducted by the Oneida County Sheriff's Office.

On scene assisting the Oneida County Sheriff's Office were personnel from the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, Minocqua Police Department, Oneida County Ambulance Service, Little Rice Fire Department, and Little Rice First Responders.
